Symptoms

After an incubation period of 3 to 10 days, symptoms include sudden high fever, headache, muscle pain, rash, and throat pain, followed by vomiting and diarrhea, and in severe cases, central nervous system symptoms and bleeding from various parts of the body, can lead to death.

Lake Victoria Marburg virus (Filoviruses), genetically engineered VLPs (Virus-like particles). Transmission electron microscopy, negative staining. Bar = 200 nm

There is currently no established treatment or vaccine for this disease. It is important to avoid outbreak areas and animals (especially bats). Do not touch the blood or body fluids of infected persons, objects that may be contaminated, or animals (including carcasses).
